To The Class of '58

A university without its students is a mere shell. It is the students who make or break a university. They are its life blood and the focal point of its interests and efforts. You who have come to Duke this week for the first time are beginning the process which will make you an integral part of this university.

In addition to the placement tests, open houses and other phases of Freshmen Orientation, it is important at this time that you consider the main purpose of your being here. Primarily you are here to learn. But this learning should not be confined to classroom recitation and final exams alone.
