The Duke University cross country team will travel to College Park, Maryland, tomorrow morning to meet the University of Maryland runners, defending conference champs.

Cox H. M. (Red) Lewis will take both his varsity and freshman squads to Maryland. The varsity will include such stalwarts as Madison Spach, Bill Griffith, John Ellsworth, Henry Bullock, and Bud Griso. Tomlinson, Kulpan, Salazar, Folmer, Spears, and Spangler will compose the freshman team. The varsity men will run four miles and the freshmen will be matched in a two-and-one-half mile jaunt.

Cox Lewis said that he didn't expect the Dukers to do too well against the high-powered Maryland squad. Looking to men from last year's championship team and gaining several excellent boys up from the freshman team, the Old Liners are rated as probably the best team in the conference.

In last week's match with Navy, a fighting Duke team lost to the Middle, 32 to 25. Oberholzer, veteran Navy trackster, placed first in the 20.6 mile run with a time of 25.6. Madison Spach, Devil pacester, followed Oberholzer across the finish line in 21.16.

Third was Trout for Navy in 21.30. Two Duke boys, Bill Griffith and John Ellsworth, finished fourth and fifth, respectively. The big difference came as the next four positions were filled by Navy runners, Bissell, Smith, Knapp, and Howe.

## Devils Soccer Team Impressive In Wins

The soccer team gained their second win in as many outings Tuesday but out-busting a Richmond Professional Institute 12-1. Last week the Devil boosters enjoyed their 1948 season by knocking off a Washington and Lee club that had gone undefeated for two years, by 3-1.

Red Rignoli opened the scoring parade in Richmond. A few minutes later Craniois passed again to Rignoli who scored easily with a well placed tap. Duke continued its slaughter as Rignoli scored his third straight goal on a pass from Al D'Alonzo. Craniois, the shifty Howland, then tallied Duke's fourth point of the period, and Jakob, after receiving a pass from Russo, blasted a powerful kick past the Richmond goalie to complete the scoring in the initial quarter. As Duke rushed substitutions into the game in the second stanza, Craniois and Rignoli tallied once apiece to build the half-time count to 7-0.

Richmond's Anthony banged one in to open the third quarter, but Craniois was back moments later to score for Duke. Rignoli, who hails from Costa Rica, made the final two Devil goals of that frame, his last score

coming on a long shot. Craniois finished the Duke landslide by accounting for two more goals in the waning moments of the contest.

The next game on tap for the Blue Booters is scheduled with High Point College on October 21.
