"Sure, Yd switch to the T-formation-if I thought I knew as much about it as I do the single wing," said Coach Wallace Wade when CHRONI
son and I interviewed him.
"But the way I look at it, the biggest advantage the -formation has is the quick pass. The quarterback takes

(1)passes right over the line of scrimmage.
The ball doesn't travel much more than four feet and the defensive backs can't stop it too well.
"In the single wing, the ball travels a distance of seven or eight yards by the time the back throws it, which takes more
time and makes the short, quick pass easy time and makes the short, quick pass easy to block. However, we think that the single wing is bet-
ter because it gives the passer time to maneuver around when he's rushed.
