With wire scarce and vartine calls increasing, telephone engineers made existing pairs of long distance wires carry nearly four times as many calls as before. This was done through installation of additional carrier equipment, requiring closer spacing of the wires on the line and transpositions at shorter intervals.

Three pairs on the Southern Transcontinental Route were rearranged, and in a 430 mile section this had to be done while keeping the urgently needed wires in service all the time. To do this, new tools and new methods thad to be devised in the faboratories and on the job.
