

Each nation serves a pairtulariati (ideology, follows its inherited prejudices, and advances its own small self interest. ... If U.N. tried to become a true world govern-ment, it would not last a week; it would be a government di without the consent of the governed and as such would immediately be repudited, by Americans as quickly as by any other group."
