on big news stories, such as S.G. A. elections, beauty queen elections, ete, soon leads to a newspaper flled with noth-
ing but "warm-overs." It becomes a campus bulletin, a poor one at that. No commodity loses its value as quiekly as news. Once
the name of a beauty queen or student government winner is printed in papers all over North Carolina, it is consequently, it it not top news.
If the organizations concerned do not want Chronicle publicity enough to save fo rus the real news values, the
awaited announcements, we are not obligated to give top billing to their stories. the Chronicle. You pay for the paper, and you are the supreme arbiters. If you want a re-hash of downtown
papers, our reporters will stop covering their beats and will rewrite Durham morning and afternoon papers.
If you want a weekly bulletin board instead of a redhot college newspaper that carries news while it is news,
let the publications board know. We are just the cooks. Your wishes always have, and
still do write the menu.
