### Announcements Vs. News

Many years ago Chroniele editors decided that they were running a newspaper, not a campus bulletin board or a sheet of stories rewritten from downtown newspapers. At the beginning of the year, we made clear our intention to continue this policy: To publish news, not

"warm-overs." We have tried hard to make this policy stick with regard to big news. Insofar as the organizations cooperated with the Chronicle, this policy was successful. When the organizations played into the hands of downtown papers first, we reduced to give them top billing on the grounds that the story was no longre news. As a consequence, there has been some bitterness directed toward the Chronicle staff.

We still think the Chronicle should serve fresh news We still think the Chronicle should serve fresh news, not "warm-overs" where sories primarily of campus interest are concerned. A polley of serving "warm-overs" no big news stories, such as S.G.A. elections, beauty queen elections, etc., soon leads to a newspaper filled with nothing but "warm-overs." It becomes a campus bulletin, and a poor one at that.

'No commodity loses its value as quickly as news. Once
the name of a beauty queen or student government winner is printed in papers all over North Carolina, it is
