#### **Naval Unit Disposition—**

The status of Duke's naval trainess became more con-fusing when the Bureau of Naval Personnel announced that Congress is considering a new bill which would re-store the naval appropriations allowing a continuation of the college inhibiting program on an active duty basis until 1 duty 1446.
