## Devilfish Schedule Seven Meet Season

Opening their season on January 8, when they meet the ex-powerful University of North Carolina Blue Dolphins in the Duke pool, the Devilfish will swim seven dual meets in their third wartime schedule.

The Carolina squad is still a strong opponent in spite of losses suffered at the end of last year. The ace of the Tar Heel aggregation is Denny Hammond, a jack-of-all-strokes. Hammond holds the Conference record in the 150 yard backstroke, but can also give a very presentable performance in the 50 yard, 100 yard, and 220 yard freestyle events.

Bill Alexander, a local Durham boy, is slated to carry most of the load in the distance events. A freshman last year, Alexander did not hit his best stride, but should rate among the top men in the circuit this season. Swimming with him in the 440 yard freestyle is Malcolm McHenry who has also shown considerable improvement over his performances of last year.

The sprint events will be held down by Hoyle Wilson and Dick Brownson. Brownson will do double duty, being the best diver on the squad, he will also hold down that event.

Backstroke Bill Miller is liable to be pushed for his top position by another Durham boy, Bill Hill has already come within a few seconds of Miller's best time in the event.

Besides the seven dual meets on the slate, the team will participate in three AAU meets. The AAU meets will be held at Duke, Carolina, and Goldboro. The one to be held at Duke will take place sometime in the last part of January.

Although all the kinks in the schedule have not been ironed out yet, it is tentatively fixed as follows:
