But, unfortunately, the men who are walling the "Sad Sackless Blues" might as well be whistling in the wind.

Here are the facts: THERE ARE 2658 BEDS, ON LAST COUNT AVAILABLE TO THE MEN STUDENTS ON WEST CAMPUS. THERE ARE ALSO MORE MEN REGISTERED THAN THERE ARE BEDS.

For the past few days guys have been coming to us and saying, "We've got a beef. We come back to school, went down to the rooming office, and they tell us Duke is fresh out of rooms—and beds. HOW ABOUT PUTTING THE BLAST ON THE ADMINISTRATION FOR THIS?"

Gentlemen, we're abjectly sorry that we can't blast the Duke brass for keeping you in the cold, but, as the old expression goes—there are ways some guys who don't get the word—and the facts of the situation seem to indicate that without A BED HAVE NO ONE TO BLAME BUT THEMSELVES.

Here's why: Back on April 1 in the spring semester, the Rooming Office posted notices conspicuous to all who shave saying that the students had until May 15 to scrape together \$25 and make their room reservation for next semester. Not only that, but all the fraternities were notified on the procedure about how to reserve rooms for their members.

According to W. E. Whitford, superintendent of building and grounds for the university, "by May 14 we only had about 50

room reservations made. On May 15 about 600 came in, and they've been coming in all summer."

Evidently because of this the university figured that despite the fact that a student was registered for classes, if he HADN'T PAID HIS ROOM DEPOSIT BY THE ALLOTTED TIME, THEN THE UNIVERSITY TOOK THE VIEW THAT HE EXPECTED TO LIVE OFF CAMPUS.

Before the war, students had to have permission to live off campus. Now—since many are married, this restriction has been dropped.

Therefore, the university in planning for the new semester, took all the room reservations they had made, added the incoming freshmen, and subtracted this number from the 2,658 beds, and this was the number of transfer

students allowed to enter Duke.

Now, the students who didn't make their room reservations and came back expecting to live on campus are out of luck, not to mention a bed.

Of course, in a situation like this—and from what we have been able to determine—it is perfectly legal for a DUKE MAN OR GROUP OF MEN TO LIVE OFF CAMPUS. THIS SEEMS TO CLEAR THE WAY FOR OFF CAMPUS FRATERNITY HOUSES.

In all fairness, we must say that if the university officials want to say "no" then this fraternity house deal would fall flatter than an ex-GI's pocket book by the end of the month.

Right now, according to Whitford, the university on campus has a contract with the university, and the

way it lines up—it is a mere coincidence that a bunch of guys belonging to the same lodge are living in the same section—along with the many interspersed independents.

The reason that no fraternity has a contract stems from the fact that everyone, according to Whitford, allotted only two to three men rooms in many instances, thus making it impossible for the university to sign the contract since it did not meet the stipulations thereof.

This rooming foul-up, it seems, is an annual tradition, coming as regularly as opening day flag raising.

Obviously, if all men who had planned to return and wanted a room had made their \$25 deposit last spring, this wouldn't have happened.

But what can you do when you don't have \$25. —C. F.

These two organizations coupled with the FAC staff have resolved to accomplish this fact and should maintain their stand in these first formative months.

This piece is not intended to be an all-out barrage of rotten eggs. As we mentioned above these frosh have real spirit the like of which we have never seen before. With spontaneous enthusiasm they have set out to learn the school yell and at the recent WAA party in the Woman's Gym the 300-odd girls rallied the roof under the direction of the cheering squad. Wake Forest will field four All-State backs of last year's North Carolina honor team in the personage of "Red" Smith, Dickie Davis, "Bozo" Robertson, and Bobby Stutz. Smith was the sparkplug of the Fayetteville team last fall while the last three were stars at Wilson, Henderson, and Burlington respectively.

Center Donahill. Featuring the Devil line will be Bob Sils, front guard from Washington, D. C., Bill Schrader, Silver Springs, Md., and two backfield linemen, N. C. and Geno Conti from Philadelphia, N. J. Others who will likely see action are ends Eason and Ballard, the latter from Burlington who opposes his old team-mate Deacon Stutz. The center spot is open with three men in the running, Type, Bedford, and Banks.

The backfield has several boys who have shined in pre-season practices. Don Curry, wingback from Miami, fits in at the position by virtue of sparkling previous seasons. Grange and Little are currently pecking the tailbacks with the latter doing the work in punting drills. Jim Gilson has been the blocking back position for some time, and is expected to live up to this completing the backfield.

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Interfraternity Council Clarifies Rushing And Pledging Regulations

Attempting to clarify regulations adopted last spring concerning the rushing and pledging of freshmen to fraternities, Bill Griffith, secretary of the Interfraternity Council, pointed out this week several rules frequently misunderstood by freshmen and fraternity men alike.

"Rules limiting relations before the beginning of a formal rushing," Griffith said, "state that freshmen and fraternity men must limit off-campus contacts to greetings."

Limited associations on the campus proper this year, Fraternity men, with the exception of members of BOA, PAC, YMAA, or Phi Kappa Psi, may not visit in the dormitories or rooms of freshmen, and fraternity insignia is not to be worn during authorized visits. In these cases, permission to visit freshmen must be obtained from the Vice-president of the Council.

More Rules

Freshmen are not allowed to visit fraternity sections or rooms occupied by fraternity men without specific authorization from the Vice-president of the Council, unless the freshman is a brother of a fraternity man, at which time he may attend any fraternity functions, authorized or unauthorized, except as specified by the IFC. Griffith pointed out in no instance may freshmen spend money to entertain freshmen unless specified by the IFC.

Must Make Average

"Rules governing the eligibility of freshmen state," he added, "that to be eligible for rushing and pledging, a freshman must have attained a 'C' average, with no failures or incompletes, for one full semester at Duke University. A 'C' average, for the purpose of these rules, shall consist of at least 14 hours credit with 14 quality points.

In addition, the number of quality points must be equal to or greater than the total number of hours for which the man is enrolled.

"Any overstatement, transfer or otherwise," Griffith added, "is eligible for rushing and may as-

Welch Plans SGA Crackdown On Gouging And Gambling

Promises Enforcement Of Freshmen Rules

Predicting an active year for the Men's Student Government, President Bobby Welch outlined topics to be taken up at the meeting tomorrow evening, including active enforcement of freshmen rules and traditions.

Pointing out that the SGA must crack down on cheating among students, Welch stated, "Those who are caught in the act of cheating will be tried by the Student Government judicial committee and if convicted, will receive the recommendation that they be expelled."

Activities for the year will include a telephone committee to work on the installation of additional telephones. Legislation will be passed making the design of the "novelty" final preferential list.

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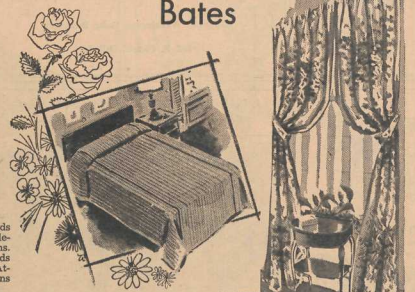
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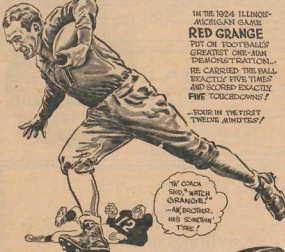
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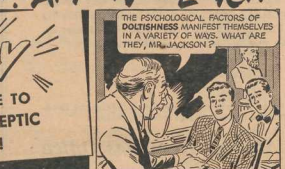
