





## Exams, 1948

Twice a year, exam periods cover the campus like a sudden, wet blanket, chilling the hearts of the party boys, terrorizing the sophisticates over-busy with their Max Factor compounds, and bringing a well-satisfied sigh to the lips of the Phi Beta key-writers.

Writing about exams is like writing about Duke's traditions, or lack of them, about the omnipresent grass, or lack of same, or about the flea-bitten Arks and the overdone oaks in the Union—it's in tune with the times. We could add in a few words of praise for the lucky few who face exams with no more stomach butterflies than they would have encountering a fabled hawk; we could console those who know they will be damned lucky to struggle through with some "Gentlemen's Cs" flanked with a brace of "Ds". Saying this would accomplish nothing save to fill up a few inches of editorial columns.

Exams, then, bring to light an ugly word—cheating. Cheating is a thing that's sneered about, laughed about, ranted about. Casually accepted in some quarters, it is bitterly condemned in others. Like debt, taxes and law, it's always with us. Preaching about cheating never gets to the root of the trouble. It agonizes the do-gooders, bores the listeners, wears the experienced. A common-sense attitude, logically presented, severed from pious musings, will hit a lot closer to the source of the trouble.

If cheaters can live with themselves, ignore their consciences, and carry on with their crib-notes, cuff clues and all the rest of the tricks of the trade without victim, then nothing will cure them but a "Cheaters Anonymous," the existence of which is doubtful. But if right-thinking students can slum the ways of the professed cheaters, they've won with us. Preaching about cheating never gets to the root of the trouble. It agonizes the do-gooders, bores the listeners, wears the experienced. A common-sense attitude, logically presented, severed from pious musings, will hit a lot closer to the source of the trouble.

## Out Of The Masthead

Taking stock is sometimes a rewarding pastime. With the masthead putting a sober and sobering discouraging finish on the fall semester, it might be a good idea to take time out and "look at the record" as the politicians say. A quick review of the headlines and lead news stories printed in the Chronicle during the past semester reveal the progress and building and the many encouraging aspects of the winning team.

A total of 4,883 Dukedoms, scattering all previous enrollment records, came to Durham this fall. . . with the Women's College meeting its new Dean, Roberta F. Brinkley for the first time. . . and discovering that the "choking rule" had vanished over the summer, to be replaced by a "drinking rule" which has proved highly successful. A room shortage on West was partially alleviated when fraternities gave up their card rooms for sleeping quarters, and the Athletic Association announced the visit of the student seating section to approximately its old position. . . as B. O. S. sold "rooters" hats to an increasingly spirited student body which supported the Blue Devil eleven, even after it collapsed in mid-season with a crushing defeat by the powerful Missouri split-T. For the first time since its founding, Duke University, faced with a shortage of funds, turned to its alumni, which promptly responded with generous donations for the National Alumni Association "Loyalty Fund" and who showed up at the two campus. In record numbers for a highly colorful and gay homecoming.

Recent tests proved that 81% of Duke to rate in the top quarter of all other freshmen classes in the nation. . . East's sororities pulled 175 frosh girls, many many others "swaled" for Phi Psi. Mary Ann Jenkins supplanted the now-married Babs as Chanticleer beauty queen, and the Sweetheart of Sigma Chi crown was surrendered to Mickey Olsen. Finally into the pre-Christmas weeks the Chronicle reported on the Engineering School's trek to West Campus and its recently realized plan for moving into its magnificent \$1,500,000 building. . . New construction had been started with a \$1,500,000 library addition and an \$800,000 Physics building underway, along with the new Women's Pan-House expected to add considerable recreation space for dating students. . . Two open houses for freshmen were given by the fraternities, and an elaborate celebration of the 22nd anniversary of the signing of the Duke Indenture was held on December 11th. The Blue Devils began what promises to be a mediocre basketball season, and special buses, trains, and hundreds of private cars carried Duketers to all parts of the U. S. for Christmas vacation. Returning to Durham, 4,883 vacationers suddenly turned students and managed to finish term papers, book reports, and began studying for final exams. . . Plans were being made for the spring semester, and, if past history can be used as a rule, the stories and headlines in the CHRONICLE will report a week-to-week history of progress and advancement for the year of 1948. —C. However, we don't kid ourselves for one minute into thinking that Duke ranks anywhere near their neighbors in Raleigh and Chapel Hill.

Braving the solemn wail of a mourning violin and the sympathetic tears of a bevy of blazer-clad coeds, we would like to take this opportunity to point out just what the Devils are up against in the world of basketball. Last year the stars of the Grand-squad were Bubber Seward and Ed Koffenberger. Regardless of the occasional brilliance of the other members of the '46-'47 Duke five, the constant ball handling of Seward and the "loopy" knock of Koffenberger created a few bright spots in an otherwise mediocre season. These two men, the only ones who might be termed "stars" of last year's quint, were lost through graduation.
