Rose Bowl" brings great prestige to a school. For more
than a month the name of the college and its football
team are prominent on all the sports pages of America.
It will be praised, publicized, criticized and insuited. The
"bowl teams" are the public property of all football fans and all sports writers.

The sports pages of America are not the newspaper section in which Duke university or any other great university needs publicity.

Universities become great and their contribution truly admired when they justly achieve publicity on the science and editorial and book review pages; when national publications examine and criticize their medical discoveries, their psychological research, the engineering feats performed by their graduates, the books written by their professors, the enlightening statements on the current and future worlds that are made by their great thinkers.

These are the things that Duke university must de-velop and publicize. It is on this great single purpose that its administration and faculty and students must concentrate every day. The greatest athletic contest in the history of the world could not be one-tenth so

This is not to say that Duke university should scorn athletics, or turn up its nose at an invitation to pit its hard-flighting, sportsmanlike football squad against a worthy opponent.

College athletics have their own well-earned place, especially in the present neurotic wartime world. Any university can be proud of being represented by a magnificently-trained football team with unconquerable

It is not a question of "de-emphasizing football." The mighty Blue Devils have brought, not disgrace, but credit to the university that produced them.

It is a matter of maintaining the proper balance between athletics and academics. If Duke university is going to have a highly-publicate footbalt learn, it must have a nationally recognized medical center, law clinic, forestry school, engineering college, and an undergraduate school famous for its high scholastic standards.

Otherwise, the vicious and unreasonable prejudice that has fought every step of Duke university's inevitable progress will find new fuel for its passion in the epithet, "football college."
