North Carolina Leads All States Represented

"Hey, ha, yow!" should be thick and fast around the grounds here, that is if Hollywood and tradition mean anything. Forty per cent of the student body of Trinity college and Engineering college call the South home, a larger percentage than any other state. The Middle Atlantic states run the South a close second, however, with 39.4 per cent. The Mid-West has 12.65 per cent, New England 6.22 per cent, Far West 1.69 per cent and foreign countries 51.0 per cent. There are seven foreign countries represented.

North Carolina leads all states with 417 members of the student body, and New York is second with 244. Pennsylvania is third with 204. The faraway states of California, Oregon, Washington, Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, and Utah all have representatives in the group. Forty-one states and the District of Columbia, in addition to the seven foreign countries, are represented.
