### Imps To Watch For Billy Myers In Game Friday

Carolina Backfield Star Is Expected To Head Rejuvenated Offense

The word going around in Chapel Hill, the home of the Tar Babies, is that the Duke football team had better watch closely for the agile Billy Myers, Carolina's great little tailback, when the two traditional rivals meet in their game here Friday afternoon at three o'clock in Kenan stadium. Tar Heels State Coachback The Baby Heels are on the road after taking it on the chin from State and Wake Forest in the first two games of the season. In their last two times out the Babies trounced Mars Hill Junior College, 56-0, and downed the strong yearlings from Virginia, 26-0, behind the brilliant work of Myers, who was All-Southern back for Lexington high for two years.

The charges of Coach Hersh Caldwell have not shown up too badly in losing one game, winning one and tying one this fall. The State Wildcats tied the Imps, 6-6, in a closely fought game at Raleigh, in the Little Blues last start.

Coach Caldwell has a number of backs who will try to match the play of Myers from their backfield positions. Running (Continued on page 4)

### Blue Devils Gird For Classic Tilt With Carolina

Wademen Work Hard After 56-0 Triumph Over Davidson Eleven

The big week is upon us once again. Come next Saturday, Duke's undefeated Blue Devils will take the field against their traditional rivals, the Tar Heels of Carolina, having successfully routed outcous Davidson eleven, 56-0, three days ago. The Chapel Hill grid machine which will invade Duke stadium this weekend does not boast the most impressive of football records. But Coach Wallace Wade and his Duke staff know an out-tilt to be feared, especially in the game that snafus of long years of rivalry.

With this line in mind, the Devil coaches have been driving from Virginia, 26-0, behind the brilliant work of Myers, who was All-Southern back for Lexington high for two years. Their attack in the early stages of the game showed that they have an offense to be feared. Defensive work against Carolina plays will probably be the key to the Duke practice sessions for the major part of the week.

In last Saturday's Davidson tilt, the Wademen scored 14 points in every quarter to their rough-shod over the McIver eleven.

Big Steve Leach led the Duke to their victory as he tallied two touchdowns. One of these was a 55-yard run after the McIver Leach rolled up an average of over 12 yards gained each time he carried the ball.

Instruction in the final group of defense courses offered by the university will begin tonight at 7:30. This group, which includes cost accounting, personnel administration, and statistical methods, will be taught in Page Building.

Six engineering courses were begun last Thursday. These classes, designed to meet the shortage of engineers and others in specialized, essential fields, include instruction in soil testing, industrial electricity, radio communication, engineering drawing, design of machine mechanisms, internal combustion engines.

All courses are sponsored by the governmental Engineering, Science and Management Defense Training program. Classes are open to students only under exceptional circumstances. Students who apply for instruction will be accepted on the basis of their personal records.

Tuition is free. No college credit is given for completion of the courses. Further information concerning the program may be obtained from the office of A. S. Brown, director of ESMD Training, administration building.
