#### East Campus Crusade

It is not often East Campus crusades; but when they do, well, it is interesting to watch the results. Right now the approaching spring sorority dances and the new Ark are causing a crusade. Here are the facts—according to the Woman's Panhellenic council.

In previous years each sorority has held its one important social function of the year, the pledge dance, in the Ark. This year when the renovation of the Ark was under consideration, a verbal agreement was made that the dances might be held as usual if the balcony and the kitchen facilities be left available to the rest of the cam-pus. A suggestion that the sororities offer to pay enough to compensate for the closing of the Ark for the night was turned down; the building was intended for the use of the entire student body.

The time came for the allotting of nights for the dances. The Administration requested a meeting with the Panhellenic council and announced that since the Ark was not making the money it had been expected to, sororities must hold all dances in the afternoon; the tact of the rest of the campus would prevent their coming to buy food in a place where a private dance was going on, and Administration rules forbid dances on week-day nights when the profit loss would be low.

Now any code will tell you that tea dances are all very well; but for the one dance of the year the least to be expected is a night affair. So the Administration very kindly suggested that the sororities might use the Green Room in East Duke or the Persident's club room, either of which, according to sororities, might do nicely for a chapter meeting but hardly for a dance. Off-campus dinner dances were thought of, only to be declared impossible by the Administration

These are the official happenings to date. In the meantime petitions are being drawn up, tempers are mounting, and elaborate plans for a boycott on the Ark are being muttered. Fines will be imposed on sorority members who date there.

No matter the outcome of this little struggle, it cannot be a particularly graceful one. Perhaps a compromise will be reached and the unheard of will be granted: the dances may be held in one side of the East Campus

I have eften disagreed with him in the twenty years I have known him, but I have elsews respected him and his actions because I know that courage and fidelity are the essence of his being and that, whether as acidier with his regiment in the last wor or as the ruler of 400,000,000 in India, he has never succeed from the path of duty as he saw it shining out before him.

Like all members of the present national government in Great Britain, he has vowed himself to prosecute this war against Nazi tyranny, at whatever cost, until last vestiges are destroyed.

We send to the United States an envoy who comes from the very center of our counsels and knows all our secrets. Although while Lord Halifax is serving as Ambassador out of this country he cannot be a member of the War Cabinet, he toill be, if I may borrow a military term not inappropriate to the times in which we liee, as it were, seconded from it.

He still attends all our meetings and will continue to do so during the weeks before his departure; and, should he be able to return here for consultation at any time in the summer, as I hope may be possible, he will resume his full functions and responsibilities as a Minister of the Crown.

We now bid him and his brilliant and devoted wife godspeed and all good fortune, and it is our fervent hope that he may prosper in a mission as momentous as any that the monarchy has entrusted to an Englishman in the lifetime of the oldest of us here.
