Not For Your Good Alone

Even more important to the school as a whole than the graduation exercises of a class is the week of elections for student government offices. This week is immi-

The people opposite whose names you put a cross may take over offices which are of more importance than they realize, which can become more important than the outgoing officers predict. For just this short period the balance of power is in your hands.

The examinations which co-ed candidates are re-quired to pass for nomination eliminates to a great dequired to pass for nomination climinates to a great de-gree the danger of politics. It helps climinate the even greater danger of putting an incompetent person in office. But no test is perfect; the lack of a sufficient num-ber of candidates may necessitate the runing of persons not fully capable to do the work to be done; small hitter-eases may amore themselves with wirepulling to the extent that used, a carain is possible.

It is up to the individual votor to justify the system of selecting Woman's Student Government officers. It is the responsibility of the voter to weigh the infangible qualities that no test can detect; the qualities which suit one woman to perform certain duties carefully and pre-clude her ability to perform others.

The chairman of Social Standards must be more than a charming clothes model; she must also be able to model Duke Decorum. The vice-president is not a hooky prize for the person who smiled almost-as-often-but-not-quite; the vice-president is chairman of judicial, and the chairman of judicial must know perfectly the art of smiling—at the right time. Members of Publications Board cannot hope to fulfill promises to see that the Chronicle is delivered promptly; their less herculean task is to help select the editors for student publications.

Casting a vote is like hiring a servant. But remember that you are trusted to consider that the choice is not for your good alone. It is for the good of the university.


