Always a world hotbed, Europe's Balkan states again are claiming major attention from observers of the titantic strug-gle between Germany and the allies.

American college writers are indulging in varied specula-tion as to the role the Balkans are likely to play in the far-flung conflict, and the tone of their writings seems to indi-cate the belief that this role will be of a major nature.

cate the belief that this role will be of a major nature.

The Daily Illinia at the University of Illinois feels that "to a great measure, failure of the Balkan nations to form at least stightly-knit neutral bloc has caused the allied powers' statesmen some steepless nights. It means that the Balkans, alighty, are still weak enough to encourage German or Russian aggression. The Belgrade conference of 1940 might convivably come to mean the first American troopadity of 1942 or 1943. For thus do wars flourish, and with this condict did not have its origin in southeastern Europe, the Balkans states have not yet lost their poeuliar power to direct its course."
