The administration and faculty are again the sole judges of a problem, the solution to which it is merely our right to suggest, not to dictate.

We are fully cognizant of the fact that the University dare not lower its standards and grant diplomas to all students leaving for the armed services. A serious and carmest consideration, however, should be given men in their last college semester who have constantly upheld their scholastic record. The University, if it wants to remain on the high educational level to which it has risen, dares not grant war degrees in manna-like abundance. 
