The peoples of the world who have and are fighting or freedom should recognize each other's qualities, learn o have faith in each other. To fight the Russian people rould be one of our nation's greatest mistakes, one of he world's greatest crimes.

Come spring, our war may again become our own— in France, in Italy, along the Norwegian Tjords, or in the Balkan hills. Until then, Russia is fighting our war— —and winning. With spring, we will begin fighting Russia's war.
