

# Blue Devils Leave Tomorrow To Battle Jacksonville Navy

McAfee Will Lead  
Pre-Flight Gridders  
In Season's Finale

The unpredictable Duke Blue Devils, co-owners of the Big Five championship by virtue of their slaying 47-0 south of the North Carolina State Wolfpack last weekend, will entrain tomorrow night at 7:30 for Jacksonville, Florida, to meet up with Georgia Georgia Georgia and company from the Naval Air Station in the final battle of their 1942 gridiron campaign in Duke Stadium.

It will be the last time that nine seniors on the Duke eleven will be starting the blue and white, and they will be especially anxious to add another tally to their belts in order to bring their season's record against service squads up to the 500 mark. Their only other start against a Naval grid crew came in the season's finale, the Georgia Navy Pre-Flighters handed them a 26-12 defeat in Duke stadium.

Until today it was problematical whether or not the Durham team would be able to make the long trek to the land of sunshine. Remembering the hardships that were met with on the Colgate and Pittsburgh journeys earlier in the fall, the team was put up to the gridders the decision of making the trip. The Navy was anxious to have the game played and the Blue Devils sought a lusty victory on Monday afternoon when it was learned that there was still a possibility that train service might be secured.

McAfee is the big gun in the Blue Devils, the quarterback, who when they defeated their arch-rivals from the Pensacola Air Station he was the power that drove the Jacksonville gridders to their 16-10 victory.

With the return of Captain Steve to action last week and after being benched since the Wake Forest tilt, the offensive line of the Blue Devils should be considerably improved and Cameron McArthur may carry a heavy load on his mind over his disastrous week reserve status.

The nine seniors who will be making their last appearance in Duke blue are Smith, Tom Burns, Harry Troelsen, Ralph McArthur, Wendell Huxford, Ralph Petty, Al Hoover, Moffat Storey, and Henry Crigler.

# All Sorts In Sports

Duke football teams have had a Cinderella-like climb to the top of the nation's gridiron since the advent of big-time play on Methodist flats—they have had their share of post-season level battles and more than their share of successful seasons. This fall, as is the case every fall, sports columnists in a desperate effort to drum up interest in their daily scribbles have tried to evolve various and sundry post-season tilts out of the figments of their imagination. For the first time in a good many autumns, these plans for a game that is not a regular yearly event have had Duke's Blue Devils as one of the participants. The latest scheme to come to our attention has wonderful possibilities on paper—but when brought down to the hard light of actuality it explodes faster than a Roman candle on the Fourth of July. In brief the idea is to have the Blue Devils meet Carolina and State play Wake Forest in Duke stadium on New Year's Day. The plan looks like a natural.

On the other side of the ledger, however, there are many obstacles which definitely outweigh the advantages. First of all, let's consider the extra practice that would be necessary. It would mean an extra month of daily grueling sessions for all parties concerned. The Blue Devils, for example, did not wind up their 1941 season until January first because of the Rose Bowl game and were hard at work on spring practice a month later with six more weeks of the daily heatings in front of them. Then the school year ended. The nation was at war, most of the gridgers were draftable, so they returned to summer school. Early in August informal practice sessions got underway with the real thing coming at the end of the month. Now it is the last week in November, and practice sessions are all through. Only one more game remains on the docket—that is, unless the sports writers have their way.

But in addition to the hard work and physical beating which the gridmen must take day in and day out for practically the entire year is the severe setback that the wearers of the Big Blue would take in the classroom. Most of them are in reserves one sort or another, and they must keep up with their work or else they will suddenly find themselves far distant from the Duke campus. Examinations have been moved up this year. They would have only a few days to make up any back work which has piled up on them during the football season. As plans now stand, they have a reasonable time to complete their term papers and brush up on their courses.

All in all, the plan for a post-season game seems foolhardy to this column. We would like to see a big battle in the stadium on New Year's Day. It would be fine entertainment for the Duke students who must return to the campus on December 29. It would provide funds for a worthy charity. But the men who are to play in the game must be considered also. They want to graduate—not only the students at Duke but also at Carolina, State and Wake Forest. How many of these advocates of the game would take up the fight should a player fall a course or two and be called to accept a military or a diploma? There would be the usual song and dance of the dumb football player flunking out of school—but those Blue Devils have more than their share of Dean's list students. With all of these considerations in mind, we earnestly hope that the proponents of the New Year's Day battle will give their idea a bit more thought before trying to strong-arm their plan into effect.
