Solution to the Problem
We have been able to glean two significant facts from
observing the general campus reaction to our two torials dealing with incompetent Duke professors. The first, which we expected, was an almost complete con-
currence with our opinions by the student body; with but only minor exceptions all students whom we quesof certain professors constitutes a major problem and act not as expected but even more encouraging, was that
practically all of the good professors (and by good we mean as teachers as well as by reputation) would be enthusiastically behind any move to improve teaching
methods. Failure to take definite setion in the light of such overwhelming potential support wous indeed. The crux of this problem of incompetent professors individual student has no access to a recognized means to a medium through which he may offer a criticism the professor's teaching methods. Instead he is forced
tolerate throughout the entire semester the incompeence of the professor, while on the other hand the prowith disapproval. The end result is a classroom impasse: he students remain dissatisfied but are unable to do
anything about it, whereas the professor continues to mploy unpopular or inefficient methods which migh When the weaknesses of the present system just deishment of a permanent medium by which student pinion might be transmitted to the professor, so that plan would be the fransmitting of that opinion to the epartment heads and administration officials as well, oxered on professors for improvement of methods medium through which student opinion of professors could be expressed and ullized-we cannot see how
here can be any justifiable opposition. It is only in the
