plan, therefore, which would provide such a respite and preparation for exams is, in our opinion, justifable. There is another factor which must be taken into con-
sideration, however, and that is the practicability of the
plan. We believe that a cutting out of two days of classe on the basis of desirability are not necessarily advantageous, and in this instance it would seem that a modifi-
cation of the schedule as proposed would be a conradic
tion of the avowed purpose of the accelerated program Any program designed to speed up the school yearar will naturally involve sacrifices, and the elimination of those
sacrifices lessens the worth of the plan. A better idea, we think, would be to maintain the ex-
amination period, thus striking at the underlying cause of the dissatisfaction rather than merely atternpting to
do away with the effects. Professors must realize that under the shortened examination schedule study time is preparation for their courses is decidedly unfair and
an unreasonable expectation. If this realization is forthming, and if the faculty cooperates with the students thus adapting their courses to the circumstances, the
