Greeks' Average Exceeds General By .240 Points

Delta Sigma Phi led all fraternities scholastically for the fall semester with an average of 1.744 quality points per man, according to a dean's office report released yesterday.

In second place was last spring's leader, Zeta Beta Tau, with a 1.647 average, followed by Phi Kappa Phi and Delta Theta, attaining averages of 1.581 and 1.491, respectively.

Platform of the Union Party

(Herein is the first platform of the current political race—the formal statement of campaign pledges and party aims put forth by the newly organized Union Party last night. It is printed in full for reference.—Ed.)

We, as independent Duke students and members of fraternities which formerly belonged to both the previously existing campus and the Union Party to crush the vicious combine system which has held the political life of Trinity College tightly in its clutches.

In support of this, our avowed purpose, we submit the following platform:

1. We pledge a complete reorganization of the existing combine-controlled election system in order to give all fraternity and non-fraternity men fair and democratic representation in a newly created Student Senate.

2. Recognizing that the present form of student government, liable as it is to combine control, can never offer a truly representative system, we propose the establishment of the above mentioned Student Senate, whose members shall be elected from house precincts. These precincts shall be set up so as to insure equal representation to all students.

3. Understanding that the present political system, controlled by a dictatorial minority, fails to hold the respect of the students and administration, we offer to the campus, because we are not responsible to such combine political rings, a student government organization that will gain and keep the necessary support for an active and aggressive program.

4. Since there is an extremely evident need for closer contact and cooperation among the many varied campus organizations, we shall form an open coordinating agency for all student activities. In short, we of the Union Party have banded ourselves together in a crusade against that evil system whose tentacles have reached into and degraded every campus activity, that dictatorial minority whose light and unscrupulous organization has disenfranchised the great mass of the student body.

5. We shall endeavor to elect the best man for the job in every case.

6. We have discovered the tactics of the combine; in the Union Party there has been no "log-rolling," no favorite sons, and no division of spoils.

7. We have, we believe, demonstrated a student whose capability, honesty, and unselfishness have been proved; a man who has withdrawn from the Blue Combine in order to fight against its evils.—Kemp Jones.

Attitude concerning the three following statements: (1) "We live in a spiritual universe; (2) There is power and there is reality in invisible things; and (3) The foundation stone in the pyramid of human growth is purpose."

Dean Greene pointed out what he believed to be the most important statement, namely, "I have tried to have better lights installed. Since the students make the major use of the undergraduate reserve room, the equipment should be to their best advantage. There is definite need for improvement."

Student signatories to the petition numbered 178 at 4:45 Monday afternoon, with first signatures placed on the petition at 8 o'clock yesterday morning. Well over half of the signatures were written after 12 noon. The petition will be kept in the undergraduate reserve room for several days, and students are urged to place their names on the petition, according to faculty and student staff members of the reserve room.

The November 28, 1941 Chronicle featured a scientific survey of the general lighting system throughout the East and West campus libraries. The survey found inadequacies in the lighting of the reserve room, but conditions in the reserve room were even below the general average, with 4 candles of light the average, with 15 candlepower as the absolute minimum for lighting on desks and tables, according to a 1928 report on school lighting conditions by the Illuminating Engineers' society, national organization of lighting engineers. Readings for the survey were made with a General Electric light meter.
