Letters to the Chronicle **Pan-Hel Rush Rules** DEAR EDITOR, I would like to clarify some of the misunderstandings which have arisen because of the recent rule passed by the Men's Pan-hel Council regarding rushing by the

Traternities. First, it was not a reaction to pressure by the ad-ministration; but action taken by the council as it deemed necessary. The necessity was brought about by the fact that the wartime runshing rules were inadequate, there was nothing in them that defined rushing or what

there was nothing in them that defined rushing or what constituted rushing. Second, this rule, which was enforced in pre-war day, is for the protection of both the freshmen and the fraternities. Several freshmen have come to me and aked if they could de-pledge their fart and re-pledge an-other right away. The reason that they gave for pledg-ing the frat way shat they had been rushed off their feet before they had a chance to look over all of the other frats, and had been "bot-boxed" until they finally pledged. They later found that they had made a wrong choice.

choice. This rule is to give new men an opportunity to look over all of the frats without any influence other than personal interests. If they are really interested in pledg-ing a frat, they can look over the whole group, and easily find our any information concerning the indi-vidual fratemities without actual contact with them.

vidual fraternities without actual contact with them. This rule does not ostrassize the frosh from campus life. The rule states that there shall be no association between frat men and first semester freshmen on or off campus. This includes visiting in rooms by either group, trips to town, first circles at dances, amokers, and any other organized frat functions.

other organized frai functions. Every frait man is on his honor not to mention any-thing concerning his fraternity in the presence of first semester freshmen. The rule does not mean that fresh-men are to be treated as though they have the plaque, but the ordinary rules of courtesy and consideration are still in effect.

still in effect. The Council passed this rule unanimously after much discussion, and felt that this step was necessary in order to give the fraternities an equal chance to look over the freshmen, and the frosh to look over the frats.
