

POLE ESTIMATES FAMOUS AUTHORS IN EAST CAMPUS LEAFLET SERIES

Delivers Lucid Review of
Goethe and Dostoevsky
Before Representative Audience Last Night

**SPEAKER FAMOUS FOR

Frederick Pole, the second lecture in the Women's college program, gave a large and representative Duke audience an extraordinarily lucid review of Goethe's last night in his address to the Dostoevsky Society.

"Goethe," Mr. Pole, who has been spending some time in America for his health, pointed out that Goethe was not only a poet, but also an artist, an architect, an astronomer, and an early, and, unfortunately, an artist, whereas Dostoevsky was as completely the artist as Dostoevsky.

From Distinguished Family

Mr. Pole dwelt much on the profound influence of Nietzsche in all modern literature. In contrasting Dostoevsky and Goethe, he declared that "Beethoven was the thunderstorm that cleared the air for modern music." Goethe, after refusing to hear Beethoven's music, years and finally being first to cry: "Such music could destroy the world."

Mr. Pole appeared for the first time at Duke last year when he addressed the Erasmus club on the subject, "Schopenhauer, Beethoven, and Dostoevsky."
