TERPS PREPARED FOR VITAL CLASH WITH TAR HEELS

Guckeyson Ace of Old Liners' Backfield; Baltimore Scene of Outstanding S. C. Joust

COLLEGE PARK, Md., Oct. 11.—University of Maryland's football coach today said that the Tar Heels of Southern conference rival North Carolina this fall will face or take in the game on North Carolina, one of the favorite to take the title. The battle between the Terps and Tar Heels will be staged in the Baltimore stadium tomorrow at 2:30 o'clock, and it promises to be one of the classics for the season.

Terps Far Outplayed Goblbers North Carolina definitely played itself out among the great teams of the land by the 26-13 trimming it gave Tennessee in the Volunteers' own ball, while Maryland, though beating Virginia Tech by only 7 to 0, showed vastly more power than the score indicates and had the Gobblers almost completely held up, yielding them only two free yards. The Terps gained over 300 yards to try for the Gobblers and outplayed and outkicked them as well.

Maryland will be at full strength for the Tar Heels, as John Guckeyson, regular fullback kept out of the tilt with Virginia Tech because a sorely, will be ready Saturday. However, Ed Day, who has been out since last Saturday, did a fine job.

A particularly pleasing feature to the Maryland coaches was the play of Mike Sargent, sophomore right guard. The youngster who had only one year of football in high school, came through his first "big league" test in grand style.

The Terps did not "pay many hands on the table" in beating the Gobblers, knowing the Tar Heel scores were eagerly viewing the proceedings from an altitudinous press box seat.

There was little left to be desired in Maryland's defensive play last Saturday and the Terp mentors will have much to think about in the offensive tactics. In addition to holding the Gobblers to two first downs, Maryland did not allow the Blackburgers to complete a pass.

Briefs Bill Guckeyson, Maryland's junior all-arounder are back who will be counted upon heavily for the game with North Carolina in the Baltimore stadium next Saturday, never played football until entering the College Park school.

In his first six punts last Saturday, Guckeyson kicked the average 45% yards from the line of scrimmage and they were so well placed that the safety man never caught one of them.

When Duke's campaigning grid machine clanked in the Clemson game tomorrow afternoon Coach Wade will be serving his last as coach leading to 123 victories against 23 defeats and seven ties since he started his college coaching career at Vanderbilt in 1921. At that time he served as assistant to Dan McQuinn, resulting as mentor for the Commodores only two years and then going to Tusculum to take over the reign at Athens.

It was while at Alabama that Coach Wade first gained widespread fame and recognition, for in only two years there his teams' record stood 6-1-1, 15 wins, 13 losses, and one tie. During the Wade regime the "Bama elevens" represented the East at the Rose Bowl clash, emerging victorious twice and tying once. In 1925 Wade's team won Washington 30-0 in a brutal-but fair contest, and in 1926 they tied Stanford 7-7, and in 1928 Alabama, with one of the greatest seasons of all time, defeated Washington 24-0. Meanwhile, the Red Bluffs also won four Southeastern conference championships, in the days before the circuit split making the present Southeastern and Southern conferences. Then in 1933 Coach Wade had to take charge of the Duke team in 1933 as his team with the Southern conference title. This year his players are well on their way to making history, but they have a hard row to hoe before gaining the recognition.
