Captain Bill Morse, holder of the Southern conference cross-country record, Charles Kopp, of the 1938 spring Conference meet last year, and Jack Kopp, letterman of the 1938 spring track team are leading the present squad in the early season workouts.

Two sophomores, Harold Johnson and Hank Wilson stars of the 1938 freshman track team, have shown themselves to be of worthy caliber. Several other promising runners have been practicing regularly and Coach Charles Ashworth expects to send a strong team into the Davidson meet.

Three Veterans Lead
