DEVILS FAVORED IN TIGER BATTLE HERE TOMORROW

Duke, Unbeaten in First Two Games, Hoping to Keep Record Unmarred

FULLER ON SIDELINES

Rest of Team in Top Shape; Clemson Now Opponent

With two wins over the High Point Panthers under their belt, the Blue Devil soccer team will engage in their third game of the season in tomorrow afternoon at 3 p.m. against Clemson Tigers. The game will be played on the soccer field, above the stadium.
