## Duke University Is Host To High School Cagers

This week Duke University will play the role of host—host to a large number of high school boys who will represent institutions from all over the South on the basketball floor of the Duke gym in the first annual Duke-Durham High School basketball tournament. The pick of the South's finest scholastic boys will be on hand for the two-day competition starting on Friday.

But this little piece is to inform you of your responsibility as students of Duke University. You as individuals are to be the hosts. Tombs and B. O. S. have been officially appointed to take care of these boys, some of whom are seeing Duke for the first time. But this is not enough. Every individual on the campus should feel that he is responsible for their welfare.

That is the prime purpose for bringing these boys here. Make them feel at home. Every effort has been made by the athletes department to show these fellows a warm time, to make them realize that this place is the greatest school in the country. But these efforts will be of no avail if the student body as a whole does not cooperate. We think that Duke's title place to be, now let's give them just cause to say that we're absolutely right.

There should be no nasty line basketball seen over the two-day span. Durham high school, fresh from its second triumph up in Lexington, will be on hand again, and will take favorites in the present tournament. But this does not mean they will be a shoe-in for the title. The other entrants represent the best in their respective sections, and we're still looking for some strong competition for the champion Bulldogs.

## Devil Nine Faced With Long Schedule

Making the jump from basketball to baseball in one paragraph, we see that it's a long and imposing schedule which faces Duke's 1938 baseball club. Twenty-seven games doesn't leave any time for loafing, and the Devil nine will be going at top speed from March 25 right up to May 22. In addition to the 14 Conference games, the Coachmen meet several teams from above the Mason-Dixon line. This may sound strange, but in our opinion, the Devils will find more competition within the loop than out of it, excluding of course, the game with the Philadelphia Athletics. It is our firm belief that better college baseball is played in the South than in the North. Take last year, for example. The Dartmouth Indians, coached by the veteran pitcher, Jeff Teraue, invaded Coombe Park and asserted a 22-5 shutout in what was only the second game of the season for Duke. Dartmouth then went home and proceeded to win the Eastern Intercollegiate championship.

Further proof can be offered by citing the record Duke has made on their last two northern trips. The Devils captured every game up North but one, when West Chester Teachers college outslugged them, 13-4, in 1937. Thus, we expect greater competition from Wake Forest, N. C. State, Maryland, et al., than from Harvard, Springfield or any of the other Northern opponents.

Probably the main reason for this is the difference in climate. The southern schools have the advantage in being able to get in outdoor practice when there is still snow on the ground in the colder regions. Down here the schools can usually get about a month's practice in ahead of the teams up north which have to be content with indoor practice until late March or early April when the weather warms up enough to go out on the field. Nevertheless the fact remains that Duke has 14 southern opponents, and believe us, when "rebel" teams tangie their always fire-works.

## Golf Team Schedules Twelve Foes For '39

The Duke golfing team has scheduled ten matches and two tournaments for the 1939 season, including a trip to Athens, Georgia for the Southern Intercollegiate tournament beginning on April 3, and a four-team northern trip at the beginning of May.

Coach "Dumpy" Hefeker announced that this is the hardest schedule ever undertaken by a Duke golf squad. The season will open here when the Devils match drives with Dartmouth on April 5. On April 7, Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets will invade Durham.

The big event on the golfing program will be the entrance of the Duke jacksman in the Southern intercollegiate at Athens, Georgia on April 13-15. This is a tentative match with L. S. U. at Athens on April 12. The Duke golfers next face the Tar Heels here on April 19, and then travel to Wake Forest to face the Demon Devils on April 26.

On May 1 the Devils begin their northern invasion against Georgetown, 1938 intercollegiate champions. The Duke team is to Princeton; on May 3 the Southern conference champs face Penn. on May 4. Temple, and on May 5 they wind up their invasion against Swarthmore.

After a week's rest, the linkers return to the wars against Washington and Lee at Pinehurst, and on May 13, they end the season at Pinehurst when they will attempt to repeat their 1938 championship at the Southern conference tournament.
