RESTRAINING ORDER

Defendants. :

This matter, being brought before the Court by Leonard C. Horn, Attorney for the Miss America Pageant and the Court having read the affidavit of Al Marks and the verified complaint and the Court being satisfied that immediate and irreparable harm and damage will be occasioned to the Miss America Pageant by the ^{alleged} contemplated illegal activities of the defendants and all persons in concert with the defendants;


NOW, THEREFORE, on this ^{4th} day of *September*, 1969, IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the defendants and all persons who are in active concert and participation with them, may be and the same are hereby restrained and enjoined from performing or doing or causing to be done, any act or acts which cause or have a tendency to cause interference ^{with} ingress and egress into and from the Atlantic City Convention Hall and burning material and clothing in public, emitting noxious odors, and exploding, lighting and distributing any device causing or calculated to cause emission of such odors and gases,

using loud and/or offensive language either orally or in writing, and otherwise conspiring to commit any crime or disorderly persons offense of the State of New Jersey or otherwise doing or performing any act with the intention/of disrupting or interfering with the peaceable assembly and passage of persons in front of or in the Atlantic City Convention Hall.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT the Sheriff of Atlantic County, the Chief of Police of Atlantic City or any officer or person or persons authorized by them shall immediately arrest any person violating this Order or the spirit of same; in such case bail shall be ~~xxx~~ accepted forthwith by any competent Judge in the amount of \$ 100., and the hearing shall be scheduled for 9:30 a.m. September 8, 1969 before the Honorable Benjamin Rimm, in Atlantic City, New Jersey, 7th Floor, Guarantee Trust Building, for each person arrested in accord with this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that service of the complaint, affidavit and Order shall be served by any person over the age of 21 years on any person associated with or acting in concert with any one or more of the defendants, whether or not a member thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order remain in effect for 30 days from the date of this Order, subject to a motion to dismiss or modify the Order by the defendants on no less than two days written Notice to the ~~President of the Board of Directors of the Miss America Pageant~~ Plaintiff's counsel and the defendants shall show cause on September 12, 1969, why this Order should not be made permanent.
